Governor Rickett's officially proclaimed October as Manufacturing Month in Nebraska and encouraged manufacturers to connect with future generations and highlight the skills, education, and careers in manufacturing and related businesses by opening their doors to students.

Manufacturing Day started in 2012 through the National Association of Manufacturers as an annual event to give manufacturers an opportunity to open their doors and show what manufacturing is ... and what it isn't.

With the support of Dream It. Do It., Nebraska had more than 60 companies participate with events posted on the mfg-day.com website, showing hundreds of students the great opportunities in their community. Nationally there were over 2,800 events.
